SUSTAINABILITY

Peatland Conservation

As an example of carbon offsetting researchers working on Peatland conservation in De Zegge, have suggested a mechanism where forum participants can support these conservation efforts e.g., CO2 compensation (on flights) as these peatlands have an important carbon storage capacity (besides their importance for biodiversity).

The Jane Goodall Institute Belgium has offered to carry out their annual forest planting event alongside the IUCN Regional Conservation Forum 2024.
