- From the transportation of delegates to on-site organisation (e.g., local, seasonal catering, reusable and recyclable materials), all areas will be set up in the most sustainable way

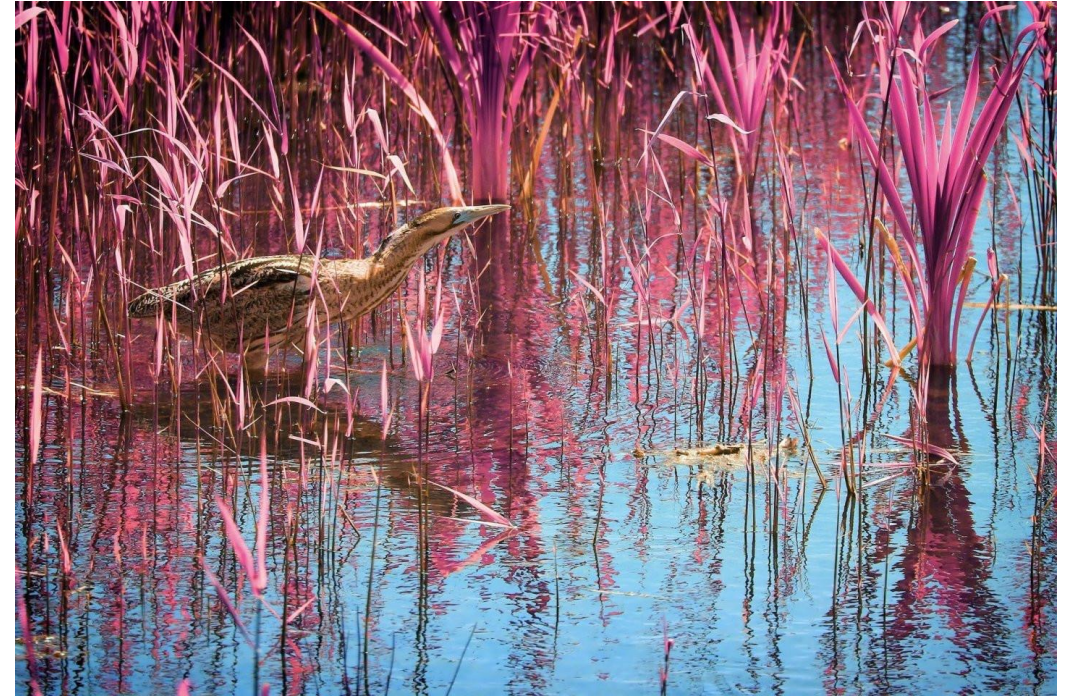




# SUSTAINABILITY

## Peatland Conservation

As an example of carbon offsetting researchers working on Peatland conservation in De Zegge, have suggested a mechanism where forum participants can support these conservation efforts e.g., CO2 compensation (on flights) as these peatlands have an important carbon storage capacity (besides their importance for biodiversity).
