




Why LER?

Rivers are the veins of Europe

Free-flowing rivers are the freshwater wilderness







LIVING EUROPEAN RIVERS for nature, for people



60% EU waters are in bad health 1/3 of freshwater fish face extinction A Living River flows freely from source to sea, and has room to pulse with the rains and the dry periods, keeping its natural functionality and its resilience to deal with climate change pressures. A Living River is then able to keep and recover its biodiversity and provide a whole range of services to people, from climate change adaptation tools, to food provision, health... or the joy of swimming in its waters.

90% of river floodplains transformed


Decline of 93% of migratory fish populations since 1970


